
"[Mrs. McCarter] was like a mom to me...we get along so well," Angus said.

SIDE BY SIDE

Third grade students of Mrs. Diane Webber had their parents visit them during the school day to see what being a student is like.

Parents got to sit "Side By Side" with their student to observe what the average day of a third grader at Protsman is like. The goal is to help students, as well as parents, adjust to the new school year.

"From second grade to third grade, there really is a pretty big jump...it is a little bit of a shock. Having [the parents] come in and sit with their child and actually see what we do everyday gives them a chance to see them in action," Webber said.

Students worked on their test-taking, reading, and free response strategies while parents visited to inform them about what skills their students exceed in or need to improve upon. This experience has been proven to help both parents and students inside and outside of the classroom.

"I came from another district five years ago and that district did this as a school...I liked the concept so I brought it here [because] the parents really like it," Webber said.

Webber is looking to expand the "Side by Side" project by holding one visitation day per subject in the near future.
