

- Assistance Call your child's home school for assistance





 - -bank statement







Lake Central School Corporation HOME LANGUAGE SURVEY

The Civil Rights Act of 1964, Title VI, Language Minority Compliance Procedures, requires school districts and charter schools to determine the language(s) spoken in each student's home in order to identify their specific language needs. 


How to prepare your child for Kindergarten

- Buy their supplies for school and home (maybe a few extra)
- Make sure they are kid friendly supplies
 - Practice using the supplies
 - Backpacks large enough to hold a folder-
 - Make sure all supplies are labeled
 - - Practice putting papers in a folder correctly
- Practice good eye contact with your child
- Practice giving your child a 2 step direction
- Practice cutting & pencil grip
- Practice waiting their turn
- Play a game and make your child lose
- Have your child clean up their own messes
- Drive by their new school or play on the playground during the summerplayground rules
- Find the outside entrance to the school
- Write name and recognize name
- Have a practice lunch to see if they can independently open up items
- for lunch

Separation Anxiety



- Picture of Family in Folder
- Read a book about starting Kindergarten
- Put your child in a summer library program, sport or town program so they can interact with other kids as well as separate from you
- Make up a fun goodbye routine and practice it (Kiss or special wave or handshake)
- Keep calm during separation
- Leave promptly do not linger



First Day of School

Thursday, August 11, 2022

- Make it fun
- Get up in time so you are not rushed
- Arrival is at 8am you can drop off at 7:50 am
- Be calm
- Talk about fun things he or she will be doing
- Pick your child up on time
- No Crying!

The first day of school is a big event in the life of a child, make it a positive one!

First Day of Kindergarten is like herding cats

First Week of School & Tips

•Ride the Bus the first week

Order School lunch to practice-Lots of extra hands
Read the lunch menu every morning so your child knows what to order.

- Label everything-child's name, teacher's name, lunch money
- Lunch money can be paid online
- Notes should have child's full name and teacher's name on it
- Peanut Allergies can sit at a special nut free table
- •Have your child at school on time
- •Keep all Emergency information updated on Skyward
 - 2022-2023 Calendar is on the LC homepage
 - Plan Vacations when school is not in session
 - Check your child's folder nightly
 - Practice their full name, address, phone number, bus number or how they are getting home daily

<u>Communicate with your child's teacher</u>

- Any changes in routines or in their life
- Any changes in transportation should either be a note in your child's folder or a phone call no later than 12:00
 - Do not email the teacher with transportation changes.



Health and Hygiene

- Health and hygiene
 - Good bedtime routine -first two weeks are tiring
 - Kindergarteners should get 10 to 12 1/2 hours of sleep a night
 - list any concerns
 - Good attendance
 - Illness Policy
 - Sneezing & Blowing noses
 - Putting items in their mouth and nose
 - Bathroom needs independently
 - Pack a spare pair of clothes
 - Buy clothes that allows them to dress themself independently
 - Practice putting on coat (sleeve) zipping
 - Where to put hat and mittens?
 - We do not play in the snow





EXPECTATIONS

- Cooperate with others
- Sharing



- Follow simple instructions 1 or 2 step directions
- Work independently
- Finish tasks that are started
- Work in a variety of settings
- Cleanup after themselves
- Your child is very important-but must learn to wait-their turn to speak (not interrupting)
- Talk to Preschool Teacher about school readiness
