SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS FOR MINTUES

August Legislative Update SEA 1

- Lobbyist working with NWI Superintendent study council is looking to visit with members of the Indiana General Assembly regarding SEA 1
- Some members of the Senate have acknowledged that their school districts are being significantly impacted by the new law
- Ideas that will be shared include looking at caps to maximum levy given there is justification for tying it to inflation since this revenue stream covers current costs of energy and building repairs
- Additionally, local option income taxes are not shared with schools despite
 the fact that schools are losing significant revenue just like cities and towns.
 Expanding the sharing arrangement of this revenue would be a tremendous
 help. (but would only impact schools if and when towns implement the
 income tax)
- I suggested, again, that perhaps a study committee could review other state formulas that adjust gross assessed value prior to applying tax rates. If the new Indiana formula, which will reduce Gross Assessed Value by 67% to arrive at net assessed value is excessive, perhaps it could be adjusted in the next session or the next budget session. If it is similar to other state formulas, then at least folks in the trenches know that they need to get better at passing referenda or local income taxes or plan for and share the reduction of services to constituents.
- While property tax relief is a worthy pursuit, reductions must be balanced against the provision of public services that stakeholders have come to appreciate and in many cases expect from their towns and school systems.







Jonathan Hines



2 What they taught

Jonathan was a professional basketball player who grew up in Atlanta and played in South America. Inspired by his middle school coach, he came home and started working as a para. 



Holly shared how to approach writing instruction for primary students by moving away from writer's workshop and embracing cutting edge, research-based methods that align with children's cognitive and physical development as well as best practices. The Writing Process in 4 manageable steps: Think - Plan - Write- Revise (each on a different day)

3 Takeaways from the lesson

-The Writer's workshop model was developed for experienced adult writers and not for children as young as 5.

-Evidence based writing practice is: explicit, systematic, and strategic brief, focused bursts of instruction to captivate and engage -Leverage techniques- collaborative and teacher controlling the pen (reduce cognitive overload and empower students to focus on writing composition essentials -Guide students through the whole process in a week (teacher modeling) -Motivation & self-regulation must be recognized -Foundational writing skills x composition= skilled written expression

Providing short, daily opportunities to write is the first of four recommendations in the Institute of Education Science Report (Graham et al., 2012)






