Core 40 with Academic Honors

Core 40 with Technical Honors

- The diploma you pursue will depend on the classes you plan to take, how well you do in those classes, and your plans after high school

### CORE40

(minimum 46 credits)

#### Course and Credit Requirements

<b>English/ Language Arts</b>	<b>8 credits</b> Including a balance of literature, composition and speech.
<b>Mathematics</b>	<b>6 credits</b> 2 credits: Algebra I 2 credits: Geometry 2 credits: Algebra II <u>Students must take a math or quantitative reasoning course each year in high school</u>

### CORE40

with Academic Honors (minimum 47 credits)

For the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits.
- Earn 6-8 Core 40 world language credits (6 credits in one language or 4 credits each in two languages).
- Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.
- Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following:
  - A. Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams
  - B. Earn 6 verifiable transcribed college credits in dual credit courses from the approved dual credit list.
  - C. Earn two of the following:
    1. A minimum of 3 verifiable transcribed college credits from the approved dual credit list,
    2. 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams,
  - D. Earn a combined score of 1750 or higher on the SAT critical reading, mathematics and writing sections and a minimum score of 530 on each
  - E. Earn an ACT composite score of 26 or higher and complete written section

### CORE40

with Technical Honors (minimum 47 credits)

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 6 credits in the college and career preparation courses in a state-approved College & Career Pathway and one of the following:
  1. State approved, industry recognized certification or credential, or
  2. Pathway dual credits from the approved dual credit list resulting in 6 transcribed college credits
- Earn a grade of "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following,
  - A. Any one of the options (A - F) of the Core 40 with Academic Honors
  - B. Earn the following scores or higher on WorkKeys; Reading for Information – Level 6, Applied Mathematics – Level 6, and Locating Information-Level 5.
  - C. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Accuplacer: Writing 80, Reading 90, Math 75.
  - D. Earn the following minimum score(s) on Compass; Algebra 66, Writing 70, Reading 80

# MOST IMPORTANT!

Must meet the CORE 40 to be **considered** for admission to an Indiana 4 year college or university.

Must meet CORE 40 to **ensure success** in a 1 year and 2 year college or technical training program.

# HOW TO CALCULATE YOUR GPA

Your grade point average (GPA) is **calculated** by dividing the total amount of grade points earned by the total amount of credit hours attempted. Your grade point average may range from 0.0 to a 4.0. To calculate your **GPA**, the total grade points are divided by the total credit hours attempted.

# REQUIRED COURSES



- **Required courses**

- **English 9** (*Honors or Regular*)

- **Math**

- *Algebra I* – if you are currently in Math 8
- *Geometry (Honors or Regular)* – if you are currently in Algebra I
- NOTE: If you take Algebra or Geometry in middle school, you still have to take four years of math in high school.

- **Biology** (*Honors or Regular*)

- **Social Studies**

- *AP Human Geography/Geography and History of the World*
- If you take AP Human Geography and pass a test, you will also earn credit for Geography/History of the World (the test is challenging!)
- *World History*
  - You need to take one of the above to graduate. The choice is yours!

- **P.E.** (*1 semester Gym/1 semester Pool*)

## Science

If you are in this class...	...then you will be scheduled in this class
<b>Science 8</b>	<b>Biology</b>
<b>Science 8 Advanced</b>	<b>Biology Honors</b>

## Social Studies

If you are in this class...	...then you will be scheduled in this class
<b>Social Studies 8</b>	<b>World History</b>
<b>Social Studies 8 Advanced</b>	<b>AP Human Geography</b>

# Required Courses

- **Level changes/Course changes**

- If your required course does not match up with the charts on the previous slide, that means your current teachers have recommended a different level for you. This recommendation is based on:
  - Current grade
  - Performance in class
  - Standardized test scores
- If you or your parents feel this recommendation would be too challenging or not challenging enough, your parents would need to meet with the recommending teacher and complete a Course Recommendation Override Form.

# Selecting ELECTIVE Courses

- **Electives**

- You get to select your own electives!
  - You have 2 full year slots (these can be split into semester classes)  
(s) means SEMESTER
  - Some classes will require your social security number!
- What should you choose? Select classes based on:
  - Your diploma choice
  - Your interests/career interests
  - Study Hall can be an elective (one semester or full year) – no credit
  - Colleges recommend 2-3 years of a foreign language. It is not recommended you take a foreign language if you have a C or lower in English.

# Important Information When Scheduling Online

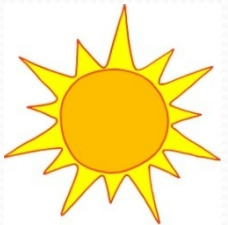
- Your counselor is the only person who can change a required course in Course Planner (changes based on summer school, level changes, change a class that a teacher recommended, etc.)
- You MUST CHOOSE TWO alternate classes! In the event one or more of your other electives are not available, this allows your counselor to put another elective in its place.
- Some electives require a social security number! Your parents can put that in Skyward.
- If you do not plan to attend LCHS, let your registrar know so they can contact your parents and complete withdrawal paperwork. They will mark you “inactive” for next school year and you will not need to schedule.



# Summer School

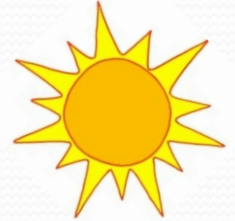


- P.E. – Pool and P.E. – Gym are the only courses available in summer school to incoming freshmen:
- June 5<sup>th</sup>-June 22<sup>nd</sup> Session 1 (*Tentative Dates*)
- June 25<sup>th</sup>-July 12<sup>th</sup> Session 2 (*Tentative Dates*)
- The LCHS Summer School Lottery Registration will be open from Monday, **January 22 at 7:30 a.m.** through **Wednesday, January 31 at 3:00 p.m.**
- Lottery will be held on **Thursday, February 1** and parents will be notified either way by **Tuesday, February 7** through the email they provide on the registration form.



# Summer School Continued

- Each summer school course is \$60.00.
- More information and the Summer School Lottery Registration link will be located on the middle school and high school websites and emailed to all current 8<sup>th</sup> grade parents.
- You can not take more than 2 classes the summer before your freshman year.
