- To correct inappropriate placement student with a failure and needs to repeat a class or a student placed at an inappropriate level.
- To upgrade the content of the schedule move to an advanced, Honors, or AP course, if available
- Scheduling conflicts
- Circumstances beyond those listed above will be reviewed by school counselors to determine if a change is truly needed. Counselors will also consider the input of parents, teachers, and the Advisory Team.
