Principal's Message for January: The Impact of Attitude in the Mundane

I hope all of you had a relaxing winter vacation. The holiday season certainly brings me joy as I watch my three daughters enjoy the wonderment of Christmas and New Year's. I'm also grateful that my wife has such a tight knit family, however, my story is a bit different as I lost my little brother when we were both teenagers. He was my only sibling, and my parents would divorce a bit later down the road. I feel the holidays differently as I reflect on what used to be. I share this because the more I interact with students and colleagues, the more I realize my story is not all that uncommon. I think many of us are grateful for the people at our table now, but we also remember the empty chairs of the loved ones who have passed. The holidays can be a wonderful time. The holidays can be a stressful time. I get it because I've lived it. With all of that being said, I do hope you all enjoyed time with loved ones.

During the winter months I really try to focus the students, staff, and myself towards one of the biggest things we can control, our attitude:

The longer I live, the more I realize the impact of attitude on life. Attitude, to me, is more important than facts. It is more important than the past, than education, than money, than circumstances, than failures, than successes, than what other people think, say or do. It is more important than appearance, giftedness or skill. It will make or break a company... a church... a home. The remarkable thing is we have a choice every day regarding the attitude we embrace for that day. We cannot change our past... we cannot change the fact that people will act in a certain way. We cannot change the inevitable. The only thing we can do is play the one string we have, and that is our attitude... I am convinced that life is 10% what happens to me and 90% how I react to it. And so it is with you... we are in charge of our Attitudes - Chuck Swindoll

My swim coach at Ball State made a poster out of this quote which hung in our locker room entrance. At the time, there were things happening in my life that I did not get a vote on. That poster always reminded me of what I could control. Every day I do the morning announcements here at Grimmer. Every day I tell students *Choose to make today a great day*. Good choices build into good days, weeks, months and years. All of it starts with the right attitude being chosen on a consistent basis.

January, February, and March are great months to work hard. There's just not much else going on during a Midwestern winter. I've always enjoyed these months as a coach and a teacher because these were the months I saw huge amounts of growth in students. These days can be mundane, but excellence is in the mundane:

There's nothing 'special' about high performers.
