Grimmer First Semester Reward Field Trip

This year, Grimmer is sponsoring a reward field trip for students who meet the following criteria during the first semester:

 - We will run a 2nd quarter grade check on December 8 at the end of the day
- No more than 6 absences (full day) for the first semester
- No disciplinary infractions greater than a detention
 - No more than 2 detentions for the semester
