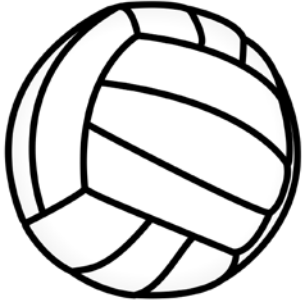
Our boys' cross country team defeated Pierce last night by a score of 15-50. The Kolts took the top 22 places in the meet. Those running personal bests were:

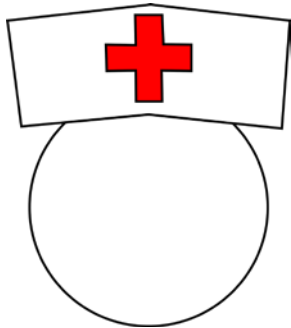
