One winning team per division will be announced at the end of the event. Each winning team member will be awarded \$200 worth of their choice of tech gear and teacher sponsors will receive \$1,000 in tech for their classrooms.

All projects are due on November 2, 2021 and the top 4 teams will be announced on November 15, 2021.

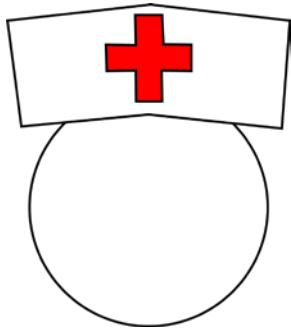
