What's new with our Wildcats?

Mrs. Lyda's 2nd Grade class is participating in a 16 week pilot of the MindUp curriculum. Based firmly in neuroscience, MindUP gives children the knowledge and tools they need to manage stress, regulate emotions and face challenges with optimism, resilience and compassion.

Early Childhood classes participate in monthly Social Emotional Learning (SEL) Lessons exploring Emotional Regulation through the Strong Start Curriculum.

Social Emotional Learning Enrichment is offered quarterly to classes in Kindergarten through 4th grade. The PeaceFirst curriculum gives students the opportunity to become peacemakers by developing the peacemaking skills of courage, compassion and collaborative change.
