

## **Community**

Lake Central High School (LCHS) is located in St. John, Indiana and serves the "Tri-town Area" which includes the communities of Dyer, Schererville, and St. John, Indiana.

The Tri-town covers an area of 32 square miles and has over 60,000 diverse residents. It is situated in the northwest corner of Indiana only 35 short miles southeast of Chicago, IL and 158 miles northwest of Indianapolis, IN.

The district's proximity to large metropolitan areas, along with settings ranging from suburban to rural, has caused **continued growth** and **desirability** in the community.

The Lake Central Community School district is made up of six elementary schools (K-4), three middle schools (5-8), and one high school(9-12). Approximately 10,000 culturally, academically, and economically diverse students are served in an educationally rigorous and challenging atmosphere.

## School

As a result of rapid community growth and advances in educational technology, LCHS recently completed a **significant renovation** on the current school grounds.

Structural renovations include:

- 880,000 square feet of studentcentered space
- Three story Academic Wing
- Olympic-sized competition pool
- 1,100 seat Theater
- Outdoor Athletic Complex with turf baseball and football fields
- 3,800 seat gym

Lake Central High School has been <u>fully accredited by AdvanceED</u> since opening its doors in 1966. The course offerings available to LCHS students are among the most **abundant** and **rigorous** in the state.

## Students

Lake Central High School enrolls approximately 3,300 students in grades 9-12. This places **LCHS** in the **TOP** 6 of the largest public high schools in the State of Indiana.

## **Faculty**

All Lake Central High School certified staff are considered "Highly Qualified" by the State of Indiana and hold a <u>minimum</u> of a bachelor's degree in their respective fields of study. Over half of certified personnel hold a master's degree or higher. Many are qualified, and hold positions, as college/university faculty. Also, many of the faculty and staff are Lake Central High School alumni, continuing the pride, honor, and tradition of the tribe!

**Schedule** 

Lake Central High School's bell schedule is organized on a modified block Every class meets three days a week. Monday and Thursday are Blue Days. Tuesday and Friday are White Days. Blue and White days consist of four 90 minute blocks. Wednesday is a "Traditional" day where all classes meet on for 49 minutes. Students are able to take 7 courses in a semester plus an extra 90 minute period that meets twice weekly on White Days called Pathways to Excellence (PtE). During the first 30 minutes of PtE, students in 9<sup>th</sup> grade will earn credit for Preparing for College and Careers. 10-12th grade students work on post-secondary planning. The remaining 60 minutes is available for students to receive Academic Assistance.



#### **CLASS RANK AND GRADUATION HONORS**

On August 17, 2009, the Lake Central School Board adopted a policy to eliminate class rank from the high school transcript. Board Policy 007.22 took effect with the graduating class of 2012. There will no longer be a class valedictorian. The following honor groups will be in place.

## Distinguished Honors at Graduation

Grade point average is based on a 4.0 scale. A weighted factor is used for Honors and Advanced Placement classes resulting in an student's GPA exceeding a 4.0. Three distinct classifications will be recognized. To qualify for any of these distinctions, students will need a **minimum of 47** credits at the end of the 8th semester.

- Summa Cum Laude, "With highest honor" will be students at and above a GPA of 4.5
- Magna Cum Laude, "With great honor" will be students with a GPA between 4.2500 and 4.4999
- Cum Laude, "With honor" will be students with a GPA between 4.000 and 4.2499.

## C•RE40 with Academic Honors

For the Core 40 with Academic Honors diploma, students must.

Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits

Earn 68 Core 40 world language credits (8 credits in one language or 4 credits each in two languages). Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.

Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.

Have a grade point average of a "8" or better

Complete one of the following:

A. Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams. A Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams

Earn 6 credits in a conscripted college credits in dual credit courses from the
approved dual credit list.

C. Earn two of the following.

1. A minimum of 3 verifiable transcripted college credits from the approved dual credit list.

2. 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams

Earn a combined score of 1750 or higher on the SAT critical reading, mathematics and writing sections and a minimum score of 530 on each
 Earn an ACT composite score of 28 or higher and complete written section

Complete all requirements for Core 40.

- Earn 6 credits in the college and career preparation courses in a state-approved College 8 Career Pathway and one of the following:
