- Project Based Learning
- Service Based Learning
- \circ Work Based Learning

Box 2: Learn & Demonstrate Employability Skills <u>Project Based Learning (PBL)</u>

Several courses at Lake Central count as project based learning

 Life Saving/Water Safety, Advanced Life Saving, AP Studio Art, Graphic Imaging Tech, Precision Machining, Auto Services Tech, PLTW Civil Engineering & Architecture, PLTW Bio-Med, PLTW Cyber Security, Computer Science I, Intro to Business, Intro to Entrepreneurship, Topics in History, French III & IV Honors, Advanced Ceramics, Student Media, Theatre Arts I & II, and many music & FACS courses

• We will continue to identify classes that qualify for PBL

- $\,\circ\,\,$ Students would have to take and pass course
- All have been marked with "P" for students during scheduling in Course Selection Guide

Box 2: Learn & Demonstrate Employability Skills <u>Service Based Learning (SBL)</u>

- Completing a season of a sport, co-curricular, extra curricular club, or intramural meets the criteria (full season)
- Could also meet by serving as Peer Mentor, Peer Tutor, or Freshmen Mentor (full semester)
- Traditional community service over time would count (not a "one & done")
- Outside things like Eagle Scout, Big Brother/Sister, etc.
- All have been marked with "S" for students during scheduling in Course Selection Guide

Box 2: Learn & Demonstrate Employability Skills <u>Work Based Learning (WBL)</u>

- Students with jobs can submit Employment Verification Form
- All Hammond Area Career Center students would meet criteria
- All students in our automotive, precision machining, cadet teaching, print shop, Sports Medicine, Theatre Production Management and cosmetology at Don Roberts
- Earn a Governors Work Ethic Certificate
- Complete an internship
- All have been marked with "W" for students during scheduling in Course Selection Guide


Box 3: Post Secondary Readiness Competencies

- A student can meet any <u>one</u> of the following:
 - Earn the Academic Honors or Technical Honors Diploma
 - Meet the college readiness benchmarks on ACT (can super score)
 - Either 18 in English or 22 in Reading
 - Either 22 in Math or 23 in Science
 - Meet the college readiness benchmarks on SAT (can super score)
 - 480 in Evidence Based Reading & Writing
 - 530 in Math
 - SAT is administered to all LCHS junior students
 - Earn at least a 31 on the ASVAB (score for Army & Marines)

Box 3: Post Secondary Readiness Competencies

- A student can meet any one of the following:
 - Earn a state or industry recognized certification or credential
 - Complete a federally recognized apprenticeship
 - Be a Career-Technical Education (CTE) concentrator
 - Must earn a "C" average in at least 2 non-duplicative advanced courses (courses beyond an introductory course) within a particular program of study
 - Complete at least three AP or Dual Credit courses
 - Must earn a "C" average and 1 course must be in a core content (ELA, Math, Science, or Social Studies)
 - Complete a Locally Created Pathway

 - Core 40 Diploma with Academic Honors (47 Credits)
 - Core 40 Diploma with Technical Honors (47 Credits)

- Transition from high school to post-secondary plan (college, apprenticeship, military, employment)

Results of Pool/PE lottery will released February 11 via email provided on the lottery registration (up or down)

Due to the condensed length of classes, students must be in attendance and participate for the entire session in order to earn credit

Course Requests/Scheduling Timeline

January 23 - February 1 – Sign-up for the Summer PE/Pool Lottery

Late January – Middle school counselors will meet with all 8th grade students

February 11 – Lottery conducted and results sent to parents

February 11 – February 15 – PE/Pool pulled out of schedules for students selected in lottery

February 19 – 8th Grade Course Requests/Scheduling Begins

Between February 19 and February 25, parents need to access Skyward and review their child's schedule.

February 25 – 8th Grade Course Requests/Scheduling Closes







