A dual credit course is a class taken in a high school classroom with one of our LC teachers. but the class is more accelerated and is in partnership with a college. When a student passes a dual credit course they will leave with high school credit and a college transcript from the college that class is partnered with. Lake Central partners with three

colleges, Purdue University Northwest, Indiana University Northwest, and Ivy Tech Community College. The benefits of taking these classes are for students to get some college experience while they have a high school and home life support system to fall back on. Students will get a taste of college while still being able to use all of their high school resources. Dual credit courses also save families money when it is time to go to college, since students will already have some classes out of the way. Winter Wonderland Formal Fun




