## GHOULS AT THE SCHOOL

On Oct. 26 students 8th grade and under gathered together for Lake Centrals first "Ghouls at the School" event. Students where able to go trick or treating, play games, dance and participate in a costume contest.

### SAFETY FIRST

Ashley Comer, Bibich school service provider, strives for a safe school year by providing programs about bullying awareness and stranger danger.

"I've done the bullying presentations that teach children to be upstanders rather than bystanders. Bystanders are kids that watch things take place. We don't want them to watch bullying take place, we want them to be upstanders, to be able to go out and make a difference. Which means we want them to tell an adult at school and an adult at home. We would also like for them to stand up for themselves. If they are being bullied we want them to say 'Hey, leave me alone,' to cause a distraction, so that adults can come and other kids can come and help," Comer said.

Comer will be doing presentations around Bibich teaching children the importance of being kind to one another and what to do in case a safety issue arises.

"I'm [also] going to talk about stranger danger, [like how] we only get into the car with people we know. A lot of my kiddos who were in fourth grade don't know what the stranger danger rules are, so we are teaching stranger danger and reinforcing what mom and dad teach at home." Comer said.



Comer's hope is that students will be able to respond quickly after learning about how to stay safe in these situations, and will be able to make the best decision possible. Comer suggests families come up with a safety word, so that in the case that a child has to be picked up by someone other than their parent, they can connect with the word and know that they are safe.

"It's important to talk about it at school because we are a community, and we are part of their home community as well, and they trust us." said Comer.

### IN THE CLASSROOM

#### **Because of Winn Dixie**

"Our class is working on projects that go along with the story "Because of Winn Dixie" to connect the text to their personal lives. [They are] interviewing each other 'ten things I learned about my classmates', [which is] similar to ten things Opal learned about her mother.
