





Happy October! It's amazing how quick the school year is progressing. By the time this newsletter is sent out the first nine-week period will be over. Grades will be published soon after and then it's time to focus on the next grading period. This newsletter is designed to provide parents with a small glimpse of what is taking place at Clark month to month. So, each month the newsletter is sent out to parents, school board members, and other stakeholders showing a small glimpse of the happenings at CMS.

On October 9, I watched Channel 5 news and the running of the 44th Chicago Marathon. At the age of 49, I decided to run my first Chicago marathon...crazy, you say...probably, but there was a reason for this adventure. You see, I had set a goal in my mind that I wanted to run a marathon prior to my 50th birthday. So, in March of that year, I decided to follow a very set plan that would get me from the "couch" to the "finish line." My goal was to start small, follow the plan, and then complete the 26.2 miles that would put me across the finish line. Initially, I was barely able to run a city block, then the miles increased over the next several months to hit a 20 mile run, and then finally on race day, cross the finish line at 26.2 miles completed. During the process, it was not easy as I wanted to quit, came up with excuses nightly instead of running, trying to eliminate the negative thoughts that I "could not do it" and that 26.2 miles was way too long. As I look back, I completed the task, received the medal around my neck, and the mission was accomplished.

Today, as I write this newsletter, I ask you to sit down and set goals with your children. Whether the goal is improved attendance, better grades in a class, creating time to study or maintain the current plan, I encourage you to create a plan and follow through. Yes, there are going to be "ups" and "downs" but keep the focus. As a result of the goals that I had set with running, I completed my 5th Chicago marathon in 2021. Who knows what the future holds, but no matter what, it all starts with a goal and a plan. If your child needs some help with setting goals or maintain the balance, please have them touch base with their teacher, their counselor or an administrator. The years at CMS are short and the staff is there to support and mentor/guide the students into being productive students.

The staff at CMS continue to empower your students to be the very best they can be. The NJHS students have decorated the windows for "Falloween" and the windows look incredible. Great job NJHS! The fall sports season has come to an end and now we gear up for wrestling and boys' basketball season. Encourage your child to become an active member of some type of club or group at CMS. Middle school is a very trying time but with numerous clubs/groups/sporting teams, the opportunities for involvement are numerous---I encourage your child to be involved.



Thursday, October 27th: "Don't get mixed up with drugs"- wear mismatched clothes


Friday, October 28th: Fall Break- NO SCHOOL!
