



CogAT Testing

On December 3rd, the CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test) was administered to students currently not identified (or only identified in one area) for high ability. If a student qualifies with a high enough CogAT score, they will then take the IOWA test for final placement into advanced classes. Families will receive communication from Central Office when test results are obtained.

Coming Soon-Scheduling 8th Grade Students for High School Classes

The second semester of school is right around the corner. As we move into February and March, the counselors will be working with all 8th grade students to talk about high school. While specific dates have not yet been determined, the middle school counselors will touch on topics such as graduation requirements and earning credits, what a day at Lake Central High School might look like, and what classes should be taken freshman year.

Our drop off and pick up procedures have not changed and seem to be going rather well thus far. With the snowy weather and plows out, cones and signs have been removed. Please continue to use the same procedures when dropping off and picking up your kiddos. One important reminder for those that drop off in the parking lot, please park in a parking space so you do not impede traffic. Keep the same flow of traffic as you would anywhere else. Please do not pull over into oncoming traffic to drop off your child. This is a big safety concern and we want to ensure their safety and yours. Exempt vs. Excused vs. Unexcused

State of Indiana Attendance Expectation: 94% (10 or fewer days missed per year)


Exempt	Excused	Unexcused
Pre-Arranged Exempt Absences per Indiana Code: Page for General Assembly Election Day Worker Court Witness IN National Guard Active Duty Civil Air Patrol Educationally related non-classroom activity as defined in IC 20-33-2-17.5 Exhibiting/participating in state fair	An excused absence occurs when a parent or guardian chooses to keep their student home in the student's best interest. Acceptable reasons include: Illness (parent verified) Verified medical visit (note must be returned within 1 week or absence will be unexcused) School sends the student home sick Professional appointments (medical, dental, legal) Death in the family Religious holiday Military connected families' absences related to deployment A parent/guardian must notify the school on the day of the absence.	Students should have ZERO unexcused absence is any absence that is not classified as exempt, excused, or is not verified within 24 hours of an absence (i.e.the school was not notified in time). If a student accumulates 5 unexcused absences within a 9 week grading period, an attendance meeting will be held, as required by law. A student who accumulates 10 or more unexcused absences is considered habitually truant and will be referred to juvenile services in accordance with Indiana Code 20-33-2-25.

A student who misses 10% or more of the school year for any reason (18 days) is considered <u>chronically absent</u> by the state of Indiana. After 18 total absences, all absences beyond that will be marked as unexcused.
